

My research revolves around the creation and application of models that aim to structure reality,

often taken from a scientific framework. Detaching these models from their inherent notion of objective observation and universal validity, I release them into the art context, where they are free to be newly interpreted by the observer.

I draw inspiration from ideas about phenomena that can not be seen with the naked eye, be they either immesurably small or extend far beyond the frame of human perception, often functioning on a set of rules, that is seemingly self-contradictory they question the natural intuitions and expectations of behavior we develop towards our evironment.

The works carry an element of processuality through me, or through the observer, these processes may act as a force towards order, sometimes as a force towards disorder. For me, these undetermined factors occupie a key role, as an agent of creation. I often implement similar dichotomic forces in systems, where they are left to compete in a fragile symmetry, ultimately shape the outcome of the work.
